Welcome to the first Kids Corner of 2021!

This term we are exploring Salvation Stories. We know that Jesus coming to Earth at Christmas, and his miracle at Easter is the ultimate story of salvation, but do you know that all through the Bible there are stories that tell us about God's big plan.

Last week in Kids Club we talked about how God created the whole universe. It was absolutely perfect! Everything God made had a specific purpose and reason.
